Poet Peter Menkin lives in Mill Valley, California where almost all of the poems were written, and enjoys his work as a Religion Writer for Church of England Newspaper, London, Religious Intelligence, London, and San Francisco Examiner.com. of Mount Carmel (Roman Catholic) will officiate. The poet is 66 years of age as of Fall, 2012.
