However, he was beloved by his football fans, including Herbert Chapman, the greatest manager of that era in English football who, towards the end of his life, picked him in his finest XI.

In September 2012, legendary University of Connecticut men's basketball coach Jim Calhoun—who had won three national championships, the last in 2011—abruptly retired. When they beat preseason no. 1 Kentucky, with its Fab 5 NBA-bound starters and celebrity coach John Calipari, to win the 2014 title, theirs became one of the great comeback stories in all of sports, a rags-to-riches triumph for a storied program and its new head coach.
